Hall of Fame Ceremony

The 2018 Winston Churchill High School Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will take place in the Winston Churchill school gymnasium Friday, May 11, 2018 beginning at 10:45 a.m. Three alumni will be inducted this year: **Judy Trinh**, Gemini Award winning reporter with the CBC stationed in Ottawa; **Devon May**, current Senior Vice President of Network Strategy with American Airlines; **Bryce Salvador**, 14 year NHL veteran, sports health advocate and entrepreneur.

Judy Trinh graduated from Winston Churchill High School in 1992. She then attended the University of Alberta, receiving her Bachelor of Arts, Honours Political Science and English in 1997. She then attended the University of Western Ontario to complete a Master of Arts degree in Journalism in 1997. She is an on air reporter with the CBC in Ottawa and received a Gemini Award in 2010 for Best Breaking News Report for a story "Crematorium" chronicling the story of soot from an Ottawa crematorium that was falling and blowing onto nearby homes. Judy's family story of their escape from Vietnam in 1979 was also a Canada 150 Heritage Minute.

Devon May graduated from Winston Churchill High School in 1993. He then attended the University of Lethbridge, receiving a Bachelor of Management in Finance in 1998, and a Master of Business Administration from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in 2001. Devon has worked in the aviation industry since 2000 working with Continental Airlines, America West Airlines and US Airways through to 2013, and with American Airlines since 2013. He has held many administrative positions including international route planning, financial planning and analysis. He is currently the Senior Vice President, Finance with American Airlines in Dallas/Fort Worth.

Bryce Salvador graduated from Winston Churchill High School in 1994. Originally from Brandon, MB Bryce came to Lethbridge as a 16 year old and played his entire WHL career with the Lethbridge Hurricanes, helping lead the team in their 1997 WHL Championship season. He was recognized twice by the Hurricanes as the team's top scholar as well as receiving the WHL Scholastic Player of the Year recognition in 1995. His jersey number was retired by the Hurricanes in 2016. Bryce went on to play 14 seasons in the NHL with the St. Louis Blues (2000-2007) and New Jersey Devils (2008-2015), playing a total of 780 regular season games and 74 playoff games, including a run to the 2012 Stanley Cup Final with the Devils. Bryce was honoured as the captain of the New Jersey Devils from 2013 until his retirement following the 2015 season. Bryce actively promotes and supports health initiatives related to concussion assessment and recovery, youth hockey and development in the New Jersey area, provides colour commentary for televised New Jersey Devils games, and co-owns xHockeyProducts, a company focusing on hockey training equipment and off-ice player development programs.

Following the induction ceremony there will be an informal reception with light refreshments in the school library for inductees, family, friends and school staff.
