Prairie Equity Scholarship	Applicants must be a resident of AB, SK, or MB. AND attending or planning to attend a post-secondary institution in AB/SK/MB in a full-time recognized Broadcast program.	Oct 5	\$2,000
Shell Canada STEM Scholarship	This is a grant that supports students going into STEM related studies. To be eligible you must Be a grade 12 or high school graduate of your school and enrolled in a STEM related studies, have a strong attendance record, and maintain a high-grade point average and/or overcome an exceptional circumstance. <u>University of Lethbridge Board of Governors Award</u>	Submit a completed application for admission to the University of Lethbridge before the deadline and you will automatically be considered for the award. <u>University of Lethbridge High School Entrance Awards</u>	Some awards are based on academic merit, but many of them will be based on other criteria such as financial need, volunteer work, community involvement and leadership experience. <u>French for the Future National Essay Contest</u>	Open to all grade 10 to 12 students studying French! This is a National Essay contest offering scholarships from \$1,200.00 to \$12,000.00 at 8 prestigious post-secondary institutions including the U of L and U of A (Campus Saint-Jean). <u>NSERC STEAM Horizon Award</u>	To be eligible you must: be a Canadian Citizen or a Permanent Resident of Canada; be 16 to 18 years of age at the time of application; have been recognized for accomplishments in a formal capacity or less formal capacity; have obtained, over the previous year of study, an academic average of 85% or higher; be preparing to enroll or currently enrolled in the first year of post-secondary education (university or college) in a STEAM field in Canada. <u>Schulich Leader Scholarships</u>	Canadian Schulich Leader Scholarships are undergraduate scholarships for students intending to enroll in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) areas of study at a minimum of one of the 20 selected universities. There are 25 scholarships at \$100,000 each for Engineering students and 25 scholarships at \$80,000 for students studying Science and Math. <u>Kin Canada Bursaries</u>	Kin Canada Bursaries is a program of the Hal Rogers Endowment Fund, supported by Kinsmen, Kinette and Kin clubs across the country. Each year, \$1,000 bursaries are awarded to successful Canadian applicants who are pursuing post-secondary education at a recognized university, community college, technical institute and other schools for advanced education. <u>Terry Fox Humanitarian Award</u>	Students are eligible to receive the Terry Fox Humanitarian Award until they have received their first university degree (for a maximum of four years), provided they have maintained a standard of humanitarian work and personal conduct which, in the opinion of the Board of Directors, justifies the award. <u>CPA Scholarships</u>	CPA Alberta Young Emerging Professional Award (2 scholarships of \$1,500 each): Students submit a letter or video (2 to 3 minutes max.) outlining the qualities he/she believes are most important to become a successful business leader, in addition to recent transcripts and two letters of support. David Bentley FCPA FCA and Janet Bentley High School Excellence Award (one scholarship of \$2,500): one award is granted annually to one (1) student in Grade 12 at any Alberta high school. Preference will be given to applicants/nominees who will need to relocate within Alberta in order to attend a post-secondary institution.	Feb 28	\$4,000

<u>John Hasselfeld Endowment Foundation</u>	Applicants are required to be currently enrolled in an Alberta public school, able to provide a written essay (about 500 words) outlining how and when you will use the funds, what you have contributed towards your goal, what obstacles are impeding achievement of your goals	March 1	\$400
<u>U of C's Pathways to Medicine Scholarship</u>	This scholarship includes tuition support for your choice of University of Calgary undergraduate program, a relocation allowance if you need it, supports a paid summer internship, and connects you with mentors from the faculty, student body and community. <u>Re/Max Quest for Excellence</u>	The Quest for Excellence program is a bursary program for grade 12 students in Western Canada. It was established by RE/MAX of Western Canada to recognize the success and ongoing pursuits of Western Canadian students in regard to leadership and community contribution initiatives	March 13	\$1,000
<u>Calgary Stampede Grade 12 Western art Scholarship</u>	If you love creating western art and are a southern Alberta grade 12 student, you can submit your entry in early March for consideration.	March 17	\$2,000
<u>Northern Alberta Development Council Bursary</u>	Applicants must be residents of Alberta and planning to enroll full-time in a post-secondary program. For each year of bursary funding, students must live and work for one year in northern Alberta.	April 30	\$12,000

Renton Memorial Scholarship</u>	You must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident and an Alberta resident; planning to enroll full time in an accredited Alberta post-secondary institution AND entering the first year of a degree or diploma program in studies related to the oil and gas industry. <u>Rotary Club Scholarship - Rotary Global Grants</u>	Graduating high school and applying to post-secondary program in a service-oriented field? There may be some grant money for you to do exciting things!	May 12	\$15,000
<u>Learning Matters, Canadian Scholarship Trust Plan</u>	Applicants must demonstrate financial need, community involvement, academic excellence, and have a career objective that will make a positive contribution in Canadian society. The charity's Awards Selection Committee reviews all eligible applications and awards up to six \$2,500 bursaries annually.	May 30	\$2,500
<u>South Country Co-op</u>	The applicant's family must be a member in good standing of the South Country Co-op Ltd. and have purchases no less than \$3,500 in the current fiscal year. Applicants must provide verification of graduation from a high school within South Country Co-op's trading area and be accepted to a recognized post-secondary institution. <u>MADD Youth Bursary Program</u>	MADD Canada's Bursary Program is open to Canadian citizens who have had a parent (or legal guardian) or sibling killed or severely injured as a result of an impaired driving crash and who are enrolled in a full-time, ministry-approved, post-secondary educational program. <u>4-H Canada</u>	4-H offers six different scholarships for students that range from celebrating outstanding leadership, to supporting members applying to postsecondary and trades schools in Canada. Applicants must be a member of 4-H.	May 31	\$500 – \$20,000
<u>MindFuel Science Alberta)</u>	Scholarships are available to students who have graduated from an Alberta high school and who are entering first year in an undergraduate applied science or science education program at an Alberta - based post-secondary institution. <u>Bayer Fund Opportunity Scholarship</u>	This scholarship is available to Canadian high school students who are enrolled in their final year of high school and eligible to graduate. Those eligible for a scholarship must be planning to enroll at a Canadian post-secondary institution (degree or diploma) in a first-year agriculture, food science or culinary program.	May 31	\$1,500

<u>Tiessen Foundation Broadcast Scholarship</u>	Applicants must have completed Grade 12 in Alberta and pursuing post-secondary studies in Canada in the field of broadcasting. Application must include a 750-word essay outlining their interest and pursuit in the field of broadcasting. The essay can also include any work and/or volunteer experience in the field of broadcasting. In addition, a letter of support from a teacher is also required.	June 1	\$750

<u>RAP/CTS scholarships</u>	To recognize the accomplishments of Alberta high school students participating in the Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) or who have completed a Career and Technologies Studies (CTS) apprenticeship pathway and to encourage students to continue their apprenticeship training after completing high school. <u>Grade 11 Award of Merit - University of Lethbridge</u>	This application is to be completed by students currently in Grade 11 and who plan to attend the University of Lethbridge in the Fall immediately after high school graduation. Students attending high school in Alberta DO NOT have to supply transcripts. Students with a 75% average and above are encouraged to apply.	June 30	\$800
<u>ASAA Scholarship - Alberta Milk</u>	This award is for grade 12 students registered in an ASSA member school who meet ASAA eligibility criteria. The scholarship is designed to reward those “Who Milk Every Moment”, achieving a balance in school, home and community life. ASAA member schools may submit a nomination for one male and one female only. The application form must be signed by the school principal/assistant principal. <u>IODE Coronation Bursary</u>	To be eligible, you need to be an Alberta high school student entering any degree granting program in Alberta and have resided in Alberta for at least 3 years prior to the application. The award is based on financial need.	July 15	\$1,000
<u>Ladies’ Auxiliary Bursary</u>	These awards are intended to assist a child, grandchild, great-grandchild, niece, nephew, or great niece/nephew of Veterans’ personnel; a child/grandchild of current RCMP members; Reserve Personnel and Fire-fighters (paid or volunteer) who have served a minimum of one year; child and grandchild of Auxiliary or Branch member. <u>ATCO Indigenous Education Awards Program</u>	<p>This Awards Program supports First Nation, Inuit and Métis students across Canada by providing financial assistance to help them in their quest for higher education.
